### Social and Emotional Wellbeing Data

Last term, our Year 3–6 students took part in two wellbeing surveys: the Wheatbelt Social Emotional Wellbeing Survey and the Resilient Youth Survey, as part of The Resilience Project. The results were encouraging. Students shared that they feel safe at school, supported by teachers and surrounded by kind friends. They also feel confident learning new things and solving problems.

The Resilient Youth Survey showed:

- 69% of students feel hopeful
- 38% have a healthy mind
- 62% reported feeling anxious or down in the two weeks before the survey
- Overall, students expressed positive life satisfaction.

# MUDLARKS CLASS REPORT

# THE MUDLARKS HAVE HAD A BUSY FEW WEEKS OF LEARNING!

**English** - In our Talk for Writing program, we have been working on the Innovation stage of our text study. After learning all about dingoes, the students have had fun changing the text to be about elephants instead. This helps them understand how to use structure and interesting vocabulary to create their own reports.

Mathematics - This week we explored the idea of duration of time. The children compared events that take minutes, hours or days. We used real-life examples like brushing our teeth, driving to Perth, celebrating a birthday.

### HASS (Humanities and Social Sciences) -

Our focus has been on weather and places. The children discussed the weather we experience in Kondinin and compared it with other parts of Australia and the world.

**Sport** - We are practising hard for our upcoming athletics events!

Digital Technologies - The Year 1&2's have been using their computer skills by making colourful Father's Day posters using digital design tools on the computers. This activity gave them practice in combining text and images on screen. The Pre-Primaries are learning to log into computers using their username and password while to Kindies are learning to basic code with Bee Bots.

**Science** - The students have been investigating how materials can be physically changed through heating and cooling. Last week we made Chocolate Crackles!

# MALLARDS GLASS REPORT

This term we have been working on information texts. We have read about kangaroo paws, learnt about how coloured pencils are made and the students have started writing their own texts about a variety of things and places.

In our Mathematics we have begun completing a variety of activities in mental Maths – this is to help us think about all that we have been learning. The students move from one skill to another and back again within 15 questions. The questions are easier due to the need to move quickly between skills.


In our written Maths we have been working on our tables and more difficult multiplication, division and working with two-dimensional shapes and three-dimensional objects.



# Look What We Learned

Our numbers have been very low at the moment, with cold weather and sickness keeping many of our families away. Let's hope that with the onset of spring, the weather will warm up and the winter bugs will disappear.

Our sensory table has been transformed into an Australian Bush animal home with finger puppets and story stones. We used our plastic Australian animals to make prints in playdough. We read 'Tiddalick' and made our own frogs using crayons, and then painted with a dye wash.

Yesterday was all about science. We made popcorn dance and erupting lemon volcanoes. This was so much fun that we conducted the experiment twice. We read 'Who Sank the Boat' and tried to guess who did sink the boat! Do you know? We then practiced our blowing skills by using a straw to blow dye drops on a picture of a test tube. 
